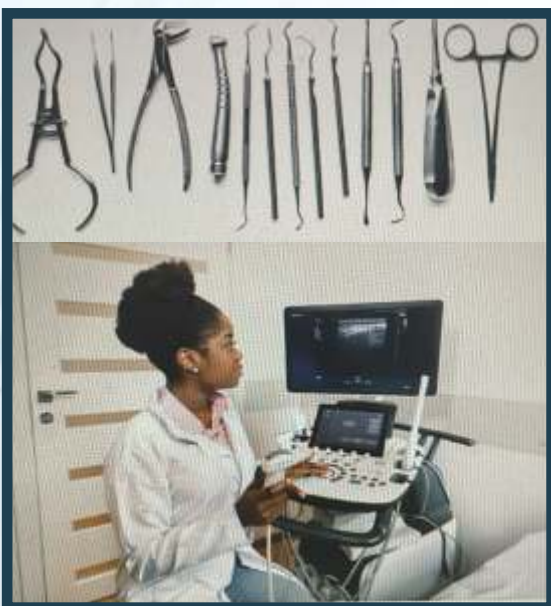
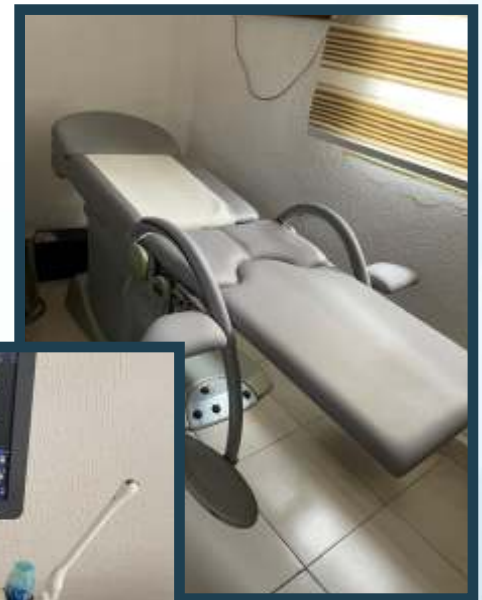

It is with profound gratitude to God and a deep sense of honour that I warmly welcome you to the **57th Annual General Meeting and Scientific Conference of the Paediatric Association of Nigeria, here in the historic city of Abeokuta, the Gateway State.**

On behalf of the National Executive Council and the entire membership of PAN, I extend our sincere appreciation to the Government and people of Ogun State, for their gracious hospitality and strong support in hosting this important national gathering devoted to the health and wellbeing of Nigerian children. Many thanks to the Local organizing committee ably led by Dr Femi Akodu who have worked tirelessly for more than a year to ensure that this conference takes place.

We are especially honoured by the presence of the Honourable Minister of State for Health and Social Welfare Dr. Iziaq Adekunle Salako whose leadership continues to provide strategic direction for health sector reforms in Nigeria. Also, top government functionaries from Ogun State, whose dedication at the state level drives implementation of child-centred health policies. Your presence underscores the importance of strong collaboration between professional bodies and government in advancing maternal, newborn, child, and adolescent health, and we deeply appreciate your partnership with PAN. We remain committed to supporting government with technical expertise, evidence-based recommendations, and frontline experience to strengthen child health outcomes nationwide.

Our annual conference remains a critical platform for reflection, learning, collaboration, and collective action. This year's theme—“**Achieving SDG-3 and Child Health Care through Innovative Funding Models and Technology-Driven Solutions**”—captures the urgency of our current realities and the opportunities before us as child-health professionals.

Sadly, Nigeria continues to bear a disproportionate burden of preventable childhood illness and mortality. Despite notable efforts, our country still grapples with high neonatal and under-five mortality rates at 41 and 110 per 1000 live births respectively, persistent malnutrition, Suboptimal immunization coverage, inequitable access to quality child health services among other challenges. Here in Ogun State, the Ojigo lead poisoning crisis from recycled battery factories with children being the most affected is strongly on our mind. While we appreciate the shutdowns of offending factories, a comprehensive remediation, medical intervention, regulatory enforcement and national action to protect vulnerable children and safeguard their futures is our demand. Also, we are yet to recover from the gale of recent abductions of children from schools and markets in Northern Nigeria. Children continue to suffer abuse of all dimensions in outright violation of their human rights. These challenges are further compounded by poverty, conflict and insecurity, climate change, and emerging health threats. As paediatricians, we are witnesses to these realities daily—and we are morally compelled to act and speak out. The allocation of only 4.3% to health in the 2026 National Budget, far below the 15% commitment of the Abuja Declaration, underscores a troubling lack of investment in the wellbeing and future of the Nigerian child.

The Sustainable Development Goal 3 (SDG-3) commits the global community to ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for all, especially ending preventable deaths of newborns and children under five. Although Nigeria's national child-health policies and strategies are aligned with this goal, sadly we are one of the countries currently considered off track from achieving the goal. Achieving SDG-3 by 2030 will therefore require 3 important steps- **1. accelerated action, 2. adequate financing, and 3. innovative approaches** that go beyond business as usual.

The Paediatric Association of Nigeria occupies a unique and strategic position. PAN remains: A professional authority in child health care delivery, a platform for training, mentorship, and research, a credible advocate for child-friendly health policies and a strong voice for the rights and welfare of Nigerian children. Our collective expertise positions us not only as clinicians, but as leaders, innovators, and advocates.

Over the past two years of my tenure as President, with God's help and the strong support of the Executive Council, the Association has recorded important milestones, including:

1. Strong Governance, Strategic Leadership & Institutional Reform

Strengthened PAN's governance framework through updated policies, constitutional review, restructured committees, and a forward-looking Strategic Plan (2025–2029), ensuring accountability, clarity of purpose, and long-term institutional resilience.

2. Sustainable Growth, Financial Stewardship & Asset Expansion

Improved financial sustainability through prudent resource management, acquisition and optimization of income-generating assets, enhanced rental income, creation of a dedicated research fund, and strategic investments to secure PAN's future.

3. Global Visibility, Influence & Strategic Partnerships

Elevated PAN's international profile through leadership roles in IPA, active participation in UNAPSA and global congresses, successful hosting of IPA Presidents, and strengthened collaborations with international and national partners.

4. Excellence in Research, Knowledge Dissemination & Academic Advancement

Revitalized the Nigerian Journal of Paediatrics through digital transformation, global indexing, expanded access, and innovative educational platforms, reinforcing PAN's leadership in paediatric research and professional education.

Adequate investment in child health is a cost-effective strategy for improving health outcomes and accelerating social and economic development.

Profile Of Keynote Speaker



Professor Olugbenga Ayodeji Mokuolu is a renowned Biomedical Researcher and Paediatrician with over 30 years of experience. He is a Professor of Paediatrics at the University of Ilorin, Nigeria, with global recognition for his work in malaria case management and newborn care. His research has shaped international policy, notably contributing to the global shift in severe malaria treatment. With over 140 publications and a Google Scholar Citation Index of 9,150; h-index 28 and h10-index of 54 as of October 2025, his work spans malaria resistance, newborn anthropometry, and the use of low-cost technologies like recycled incubators and phototherapy units to reduce neonatal mortality.

Professor Mokuolu has supported African nations in securing over \$3 billion in health funding and played a pivotal role in developing malaria strategic plans. He served as Nigeria's National Malaria Technical Director (2018–2022) and was Portfolio Director for Malaria Projects at Management Sciences for Health, USA. He has chaired WHO expert groups and currently co-chairs the RBM Case Management Working Group and leads the WHO Antimalarial Guideline Development Group. He is currently the Strategic Adviser to the Honorable Ministers of Health on Malaria Elimination in Nigeria. A mentor to over 28 doctoral/fellowship candidates, seven of whom are now Professors, he is passionate about character development and youth empowerment. He founded the Centre for Malaria and Other Tropical Diseases Care and the Child Survival Foundation International. Regarding the later, he collaborated with ophthalmologist to reach over 5000 children under 2years and 20,000 school aged children in blindness prevention projects. His accolades include being named a UN Champion to End Malaria (2010), co-winning the NLNG Prize for Science (2017), and being recognized among Africa's top 20 malaria heroes (2023). He also serves as Chaplain at the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital's Chapel of Christ the Healer.

Speaker's Profile

Professor Adebola Emmanuel Orimadegun is a Professor of Paediatrics and Epidemiology at the Institute of Child Health, College of Medicine, University of Ibadan, Nigeria, and a Consultant Paediatrician at the University College Hospital (UCH), Ibadan. He is a Fellow of the West African College of Physicians (FWACP) in Paediatrics and holds advanced postgraduate qualifications in Epidemiology and Clinical Trials, including a PhD in Epidemiology from the University of Ibadan and an MSc in Clinical Trials from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

Professor Orimadegun is an established clinician–scientist whose work sits at the intersection of child health, epidemiology, health systems research, and methodological rigor. Over more than two decades, his research has addressed priority paediatric conditions in Nigeria and sub-Saharan Africa, including malaria, childhood infections, hypoxaemia, nutrition, immunisation, neonatal outcomes, and health service utilisation. His scholarship is characterised by a strong commitment to translating research evidence into policy-relevant and practice-oriented insights.

He has served as Principal Investigator or Co-Principal Investigator on several nationally and internationally funded studies, including Therapeutic Efficacy Studies of antimalarial medicines supported by the U.S. President's Malaria Initiative and the Federal Ministry of Health, Nigeria; TETFund-supported clinical and epidemiological research; and multi-country collaborative projects funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the Medical Research Council (UK), EDCTP, and the NIH. He currently leads and contributes to large, multidisciplinary programmes focused on child survival, nutrition, malaria epidemiology, and health system performance.

Beyond quantitative epidemiology and clinical trials, Professor Orimadegun has increasingly championed qualitative and mixed-methods approaches in child health research. His work recognises that clinical

outcomes are deeply shaped by caregiver perceptions, social norms, health system interactions, and community contexts, dimensions that cannot be adequately understood through numerical indicators alone. He has published and supervised research exploring caregiver experiences, health-seeking behaviour, immunisation practices, and the social determinants of paediatric morbidity and mortality, advocating for more humane, context-sensitive models of child health care.

A respected teacher and mentor, Professor Orimadegun has trained medical students, paediatric residents, MSc, MPH, MPhil, MD, and PhD candidates across disciplines including Paediatrics, Epidemiology, Public Health, and Clinical Research. He has served as external examiner to several Nigerian universities, the University of Cape Town (South Africa), and Wageningen University & Research (The Netherlands). He is actively involved in postgraduate curriculum development and capacity building for clinician-scientists across Africa.

Professor Orimadegun is a member of multiple professional and scientific bodies, including the Paediatric Association of Nigeria, the West African College of Physicians, the American Thoracic Society, the European Respiratory Society, and the Malaria Genomic Epidemiology Network. He also serves on editorial and review panels for peer-reviewed journals and research funding agencies.

His scholarly output includes over 120 peer-reviewed publications spanning paediatric infectious diseases, malaria, nutrition, neonatal and adolescent health, epidemiology, and research methodology. Throughout his career, he has consistently argued for a more integrated vision of child health, one that balances biomedical excellence with ethical sensitivity, disciplined listening, and attention to lived experience.

As the NJP Hour speaker at PANCONF 2026, Professor Orimadegun brings a distinctive perspective shaped by years of frontline paediatric practice, rigorous epidemiological research, and sustained engagement with health systems and communities. His lecture, *Beyond the Stethoscope: Humanising Child Health through Qualitative Inquiry*, reflects his conviction that healing in paediatrics begins not only with accurate diagnosis and effective treatment, but with understanding the child and family as whole persons embedded in social worlds.

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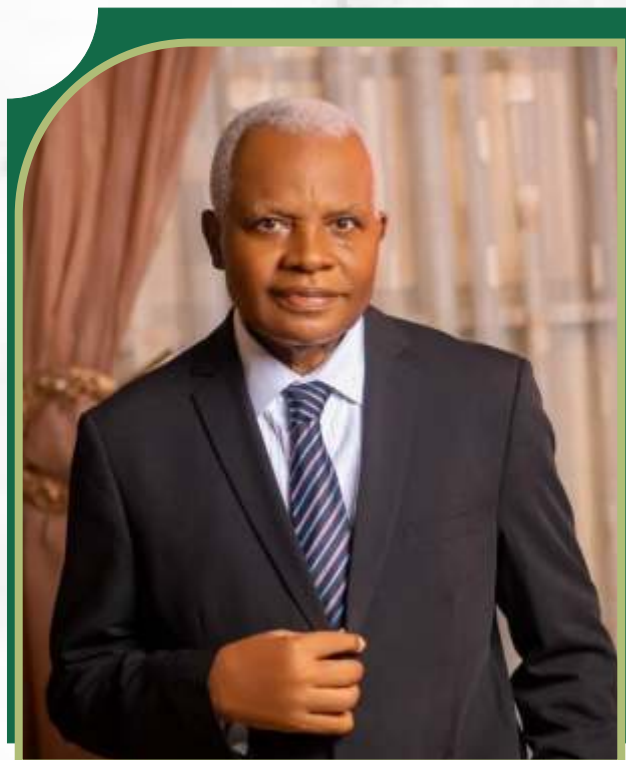

In the NMMA's tradition, a year's award is usually given in recognition of work done in the preceding year. It was the first time the top prize would come to the TVC Communications family. For someone who had his editorial nativity in the print media, this is one feat that has remained largely unsung.

A historian by training, Babajide the man, is a combination of a prodigious intellect, years of journalistic field operations, extensive travels and a profoundly proven passion for the security and wellbeing of his fatherland and fellow countrymen and women. This passion is easily noticeable in his impassioned approach to conversations on the nation's multiple award-winning political talk show, Journalists' Hangout. 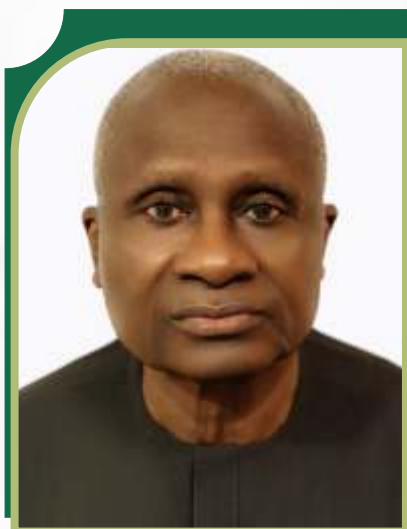

He is a Fellow of the West African College of Physicians (FWACP) in Paediatrics and holds advanced postgraduate qualifications in Epidemiology and Clinical Trials, including a PhD in Epidemiology from the University of Ibadan and an MSc in Clinical Trials from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine.

Professor Orimadegun is an established clinician–scientist whose work sits at the intersection of child health, epidemiology, health systems research, and methodological rigor. Over more than two decades, his research has addressed priority paediatric conditions in Nigeria and sub-Saharan Africa, including malaria, childhood infections, hypoxaemia, nutrition, immunisation, neonatal outcomes, and health service utilisation. His scholarship is characterised by a strong commitment to translating research evidence into policy-relevant and practice-oriented insights.

He has served as Principal Investigator or Co-Principal Investigator on several nationally and internationally funded studies, including Therapeutic Efficacy Studies of antimalarial medicines supported by the U.S. President's Malaria Initiative and the Federal Ministry of Health, Nigeria; TETFund-supported clinical and epidemiological research; and multi-country collaborative projects funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the Medical Research Council (UK), EDCTP, and the NIH. He currently leads and contributes to large, multidisciplinary programmes focused on child survival, nutrition, malaria epidemiology, and health system performance.

Beyond quantitative epidemiology and clinical trials, Professor Orimadegun has increasingly championed qualitative and mixed-methods approaches in child health research. His work recognises that clinical outcomes are deeply shaped by caregiver perceptions, social norms, health system interactions, and community contexts, dimensions that cannot be adequately understood through numerical indicators alone. He has published and supervised research exploring caregiver experiences, health-seeking behaviour, immunisation practices, and the social determinants of paediatric morbidity and mortality, advocating for more humane, context-sensitive models of child health care.

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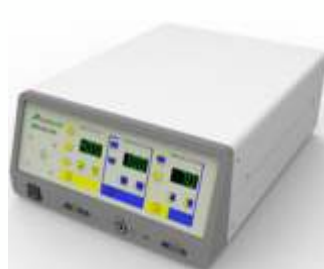

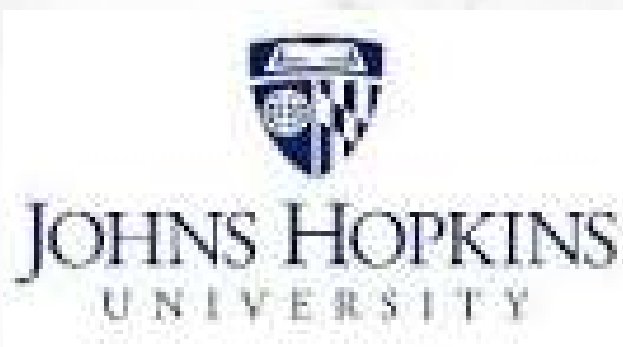
